

FIRE SAFETY REGULATIONS

MATE DORMITORIES

The 1996 law number XXXI about protection from fire, technical backup and the fire department, and the Ministry of Internal Affairs Regulation number 54/2014. (XII.5.) about the National Fire Safety Regulations, furthermore the Fire Safety Regulations of the University contain the fire safety usage rules regarding buildings and parts of buildings. Those working, living, and temporarily working in the building must know and comply with.

The most important rules are the following:

1. It is strictly forbidden to use an open fire and to smoke in the buildings! Smoking is only allowed in the designated smoking places.
2. Occasional activities with a fire hazard (e.g. lighting a fire in the open-air fireplaces, welding) are only allowed with permission. Permission can be obtained by writing an e-mail to boros.andrea@uni-mate.hu.
3. It is strictly forbidden to store any material, tool or furniture in the evacuation pathways.
4. It is strictly forbidden to block the exits in any way.
5. It is strictly forbidden to block access to fire extinguisher devices, hydrant-boxes, connectors by putting anything in front of them.
6. It is forbidden to leave stoves unattended while they are in use. After use, stoves must be turned off. In the case of using a gas bottle, the bottle must be turned off after use.
7. Heating appliances must be left free at all times. It is forbidden to put any flammable objects on them.
8. It is forbidden to store anything in the area of the staircases and in the hallways.
9. If you detect fire, you must immediately notify the Fire Department by calling the emergency telephone number 112 and you must report it to either Reception as well.
10. When reporting a fire, you must give the following data:
 - the name of the establishment, its exact address, the exact premises of the fire
 - in which part of the building the fire started and the size of the area it extended to
 - what is on fire, what is in danger
 - whether human lives are in danger
 - name of the person reporting the fire and the number of the telephone that is being used to reporting the fire
11. In the case of fire, everyone must leave the building using the designated evacuation pathways.
